Chilika Development Authority has been carrying out close monitoring of Chilika Lake, continuously after the hydrological intervention in 2000. In the mean time it is realized that there are certain research gaps which need to be bridged through focused study/research. One of the major gap is the study of microbes and the role they play in bio-geo-chemicals cycles of the lake ecosystem. This information is essential for development of an ecological model. Thus, it has become imperative to conduct a science workshop to identify the research gaps and to strengthen the ongoing research of Chilika Lake.



The lake research (limnology) is well developed in Switzerland. To explore the possible collaboration, Chilika Development Authority (CDA) contacted Dr. Mattia Celio Science & Technology counselor from Swiss Embassy, New Delhi, who visited Chilika Lake in April 2011. After his visit he was briefed about the current status to assist CDA for a collaborative science workshop at Chilika and he agreed to this.

The objective of the workshop is on one hand to allow the Swiss participants to get familiar with the main issues and ongoing research related to the Chilika Lake, and on the other hand to assess research gaps opportunities and explore possible areas of collaboration between Swiss and Indian Scientists. The experts from reputed Universities/Institutions from India have participated in the workshop.
